

Dear Staff, Students, and Parents/Guardians,

As we get closer to the start of the 2020-2021 school year, we would like to inform you of the below safety protocols that we are following for anyone visiting our school campuses. We expect these protocols to continue into the school year, subject to change, as ordered by the Cook County Department of Public Health.

Temperature Checks

Anyone visiting our campuses for athletic camps, meetings, or other activities is required to complete a [daily health questionnaire](#) prior to arriving each day. Coaches or the paraprofessional on duty will confirm the submission upon arrival by scanning your ID or entering your ID number. If the daily health questionnaire is not complete, the individual will complete the questionnaire on-site before entering. In addition, *on-site temperature checks will be conducted for everyone*. We do ask that families take the time to complete the health questionnaire prior to arriving on campus, as that allows for the on-site check in process to move as quickly as possible.

Travel Guidance

The Cook County Department of Health recently released the following guidance: “Any person entering suburban Cook County living in a high-incidence state, or who visited the high-incidence state for more than 24 hours is recommended to self-quarantine for 14 days after arrival, or for the duration of their stay in suburban Cook County, whichever is shorter.” The current list of states is as follows:
